


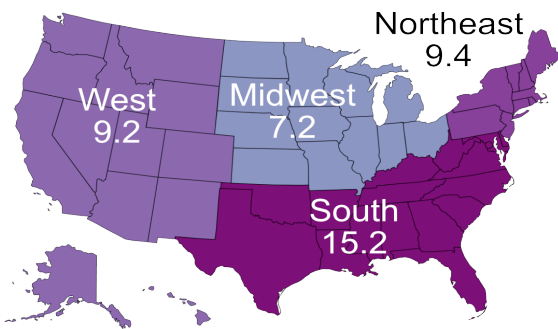

of HIV diagnoses in the United States occurred in Black Americans in 2019

-  28% in Hispanic/Latino Americans
-  25% in White Americans
-  5% in other Americans

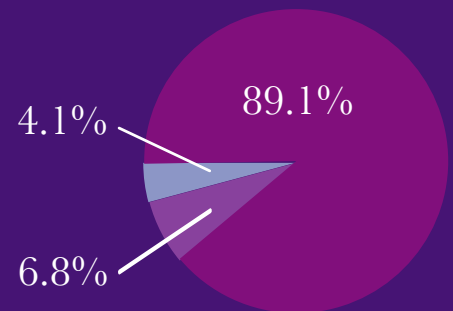
The rate of new HIV diagnoses in Black Women is **4x** greater than Hispanic/Latino Women and **11x** greater than White Women



The American South has the highest rate of new HIV diagnoses in the United States, with an incidence rate of **15.2** (per 100,000), compared to the national rate of **12.6**

Modes of Transmission:

- Majority (89.1%) of HIV diagnoses are sexually transmitted
- 6.8% are the result of Injection Drug Use (IDU)
- 4.1% involved a combination of male-to-male sexual contact and IDU
